

Directions for Cutting out the Pattern.

for the right-hand Mitten, just as the cloth should be cut also, follow the line for the thumb hole and fold it back, exactly in the centre. The thumb pattern fits both To cut the thumb-piece follow the printed line, and fold centre, with the printing outside, and you have the pattern but do not cut it of; then fold the pattern exactly in the Follow the printed line at the margin of the printing

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
